- ❖ 3-day Annual Sindhu Darshan Festival Begins In Ladakh RegioN: The three-day annual Sindhu Darshan Festival celebrations on the bank of Indus River started in Ladakh region of Jammu

and Kashmir. The Festival was organised by Sindhu Darshan Yatra Samiti and Ladakh Phandey Tsogspa, Leh. This year marked the 22nd Sindhu Darshan festival and it was started by the former Deputy Prime Minister L K Advani in 1997.

- **❖** India, Bangladesh Navies Institute Annual Coordinated Patrol: CORPAT
 - India and Bangladesh have agreed to institute Coordinated Patrol (CORPAT) as an annual exercise between navies of two neighbouring countries.
 - ii. The first edition of CORPAT between two navies was inaugurated by Indian Navy's Chief Admiral Sunil Lanba during his visit to Bangladesh. The aim Navy Chief's visit was to consolidate bilateral defence relations between India and Bangladesh and to explore new avenues for naval cooperation.

❖ Indian, Indonesian Navies Participate In Passage Exercise: PASSEX 2018: The navies of India and Indonesia participated in Passage Exercise (PASSEX). - ❖ World's Largest Multilateral Naval Exercise RIMPAC Begins: world's largest multilateral naval exercise Rim of the Pacific (RIMPAC) begun off Hawaii in the Western Pacific Ocean. The two-month long biennial exercise is likely to be attended by navies of 26 countries including India. Indian Naval Ship Sahyadri has already reached the Pearl Harbour in Hawaii to participate in the 26th edition of RIMPAC exercise.
- ❖ Nepal PM KP Sharma Oli Visits China, Signed Agreements: Nepali Prime Minister Khadga Prasad Sharma Oli is on his first visit to China after assuming the charge as Prime Minister. China will build a railway connecting the western region of Tibet with Nepal, one of several bilateral deals signed during Oli's visit to Beijing. The link will connect the Tibetan city of Xigaze with Nepal's capital Kathmandu.

- ❖ S Ramesh Appointed Chairman of CBIC: Senior bureaucrat S Ramesh has been appointed as chairman of the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC), the apex policy-making body for indirect taxes. He succeeded Vanaja N Sarna. Ramesh is at present the member in the board, mandated with the responsibility of implementing the Goods and Services Tax (GST).
- ❖ Arijit Basu Appointed SBI's New Managing Director: The government appointed Arjit Basu as Managing Director of the country's largest lender State Bank of India (SBI). He will fill the position that fell vacant following the elevation of Rajnish Kumar as the chairman. Now, after this, the SBI will have four managing directors. As per the SBI Act, the bank can have four managing directors. Mr Basu has held several key positions in various circles of SBI including the bank's office in Tokyo, Japan.
- ❖ B Sriram Appointed IDBI Bank's MD And CEO: State Bank of India's (SBI) Managing Director B Sriram was appointed as the IDBI Bank's CEO and Managing Director for a temporary period of three months. He has been

appointed in place of incumbent Mahesh Kumar Jain who was recently named **Deputy Governor** of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

- Pulitzer Prize-Winning Political Commentator Charles Krauthammer Passes Away: United States political commentator and Pulitzer Prize winner Charles Krauthammer passed away at the age of 68. The columnist died of cancer of the small intestine.

- ❖ Economist Lawrence Haddad, Dr David Nabarro Awarded World Food Prize: Lawrence Haddad, who is a British economist and food policy researcher, and Dr David Nabarro, who has worked with the World Health Organization and United Nations on health and hunger issues, were named the 2018 World Food Prize recipients in a ceremony at the U.S. Department of Agriculture in Washington.
- * Kalki Koechlin Conferred With French Honour: Kalki Koechlin was conferred with the French distinction of Knight of the Order of Arts and Letters (Chevalier dans l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres), for her contribution in enhancing Indo-French ties in cinema.

❖ India's R Praggnanandhaa Becomes World's 2nd Youngest Chess Grand Master: India's R Praggnanandhaa has become the country's youngest and the world's second youngest Grand Master at the age of 12 years, 10 months and 13 days after reaching the final round of the ongoing Grendine Open in Italy.

- ❖ Archer Deepika Kumari Wins Gold at Salt Lake World Cup: Archer Deepika Kumari won her first individual gold medal in six years at the Salt Lake World Cup, in the USA. She defeated Germany's Michelle Kroppen in the recurve final.
- ❖ Sandeep Sejwal Wins Gold In Singapore National Swimming Championships: Indian swimmer Sandeep Sejwal put up an impressive performance to clinch the gold medal in men's 50m breaststroke event at the Singapore National Swimming Championships in Singapore. Besides, Virdhawal Khade grabbed a creditable silver medal in the 50m freestyle event with a timing of 22.68 seconds
- ❖ Lewis Hamilton Wins French Grand Prix: Lewis Hamilton (Mercedes) reclaimed the world championship lead with a dominant victory in the French Grand Prix. The Mercedes driver led from start to finish other than one lap around his pit stop to move 14 points ahead of Ferrari's Sebastian Vettel, who finished fifth. Max Verstappen of Red Bull finished 2nd in the race.
- ❖ 18. ISSF Junior World Cup: Saurabh Chaudhary Sets World Record, Wins Gold Sixteen-year-old Indian shooter Saurabh Chaudhary set a new world record on the way to winning a gold medal in the ISSF Junior World Cup in Suhl, Germany. Saurabh shot a total of 243.7 in the 10m air pistol event in the ongoing International Shooting Sports Federation (ISSF) tournament.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

Russia To Supply Technical Security Equipment to India: Russian State Atomic Energy Corporation (Rosatom) had announced that its subsidiary Nikiret has signed an agreement with Indian engineering services firm Core Energy Systems Pvt Ltd for the promotion of its technical security equipment in India. The partnership will explore opportunities in the Indian government's Comprehensive Integrated Border Management System (CIBMS) project.

PLACES IN NEWS

- ❖ Gujarat: The world's first of its kind and state-ofthe-art International Centre for 'Humanitarian Forensics' (ICHF) was launched at the Gujarat Forensic Sciences University in Gandhinagar, Gujarat. The main aim of the Centre would be to provide service to the nation and to the entire world when the need arises.
- Surat: Under 'India Smart Cities Award' 2018, Surat has been awarded for showcasing "great momentum" in the implementation of projects under the Smart Cities Mission, according to the Housing and Urban Affairs (HUA) Ministry. Bhopal and Ahmedabad were selected in the 'Innovative Idea' category for "transformative approach towards sustainable integrated development".
- ❖ Gujarat: The Gujarat government announced wind-solar hybrid power policy 2018, aiming to make optimum utilisation of the land and grid. The policy provides 50% concession for cross-subsidy surcharge and additional surcharge when the generated energy is sold to a third party. Gujarat currently generates over 5,500 MW of wind power and 1,600 MW of solar power.
